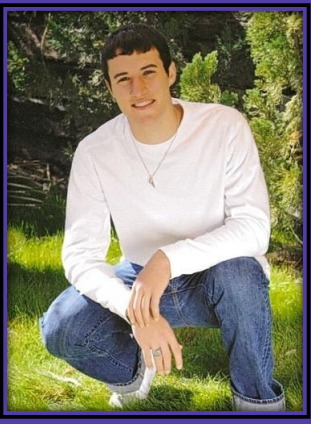

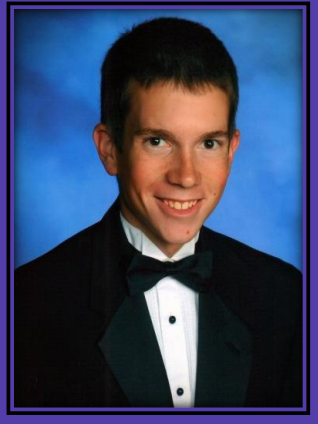

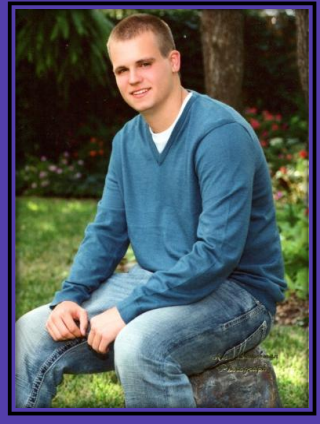

Have you ever celebrated both Easter and New Year's Day on the same day? That was Robert's experience as he had lunch with a group of Burmese refugees on Easter Sunday. As in Thailand, New Year Day in Burma is in April, so our Bengali Burmese friends invited other Burmese refugees to lunch. There were at least 4 different ethnicities there besides Swedish-American. Robert was able to share the gospel story with both Hindus and Buddhists. The day before I was sharing with my Caucasian neighbor that the gospel accounts are trustworthy and reliable: these are the typical roadblocks to faith for a 21st century Caucasian. For my refugee friends from Burma, the questions are quite different. Rather than talking about the reliability of scripture, they need to hear the difference between resurrection and reincarnation. Rather than archeological evidence, they need to hear that Jesus actually ate with his disciples after the resurrection, so that they know that Jesus wasn't just a ghost or spirit. Pray for our efforts to share our faith with those around us as well as our work to train up new workers for the harvest. The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few.

Jon continues to support Frontiers' "50 in 5" goal—a goal of launching 50 new church-planting teams to "unengaged" Muslim people groups, within a five-year period. These unengaged people groups (some with populations in the tens of millions) have no long-term missionaries serving among them. Our consistent prayer is that through Jon's speaking and training ministry, many thousands of Christians will be challenged to action by the needs of those who live "without hope and without God in the world" (Eph. 2:12). Here's what one person wrote to Jon recently: *"I would ask that you pray for my wife and me. We are taking a big step of faith in response to what we have learned from you and others. We are now looking for ways to minister full-time to Arabic Muslims. Please ask God to continue to use Jon to multiply Kingdom laborers for the harvest."*

Seder Dinner



Apple Delight

Charoseth is one of the seven foods represented on the Seder plate. It represents the mortar the Israelites had to use in doing Pharaohs' labor.

Ingredients: Walnuts, apples, raisins, Cinnamon, Wine (manischewitz) or grape juice.

¼ cup walnuts, ¼ cup raisins, ½ cup apples.

1. Use rolling pin to break up the walnuts.
2. Use a cutting board to dice up the apples (un-peeled) as soon as the apples are diced put them in water.
3. Mix an equal amount of raisins and walnuts and sprinkle in cinnamon.
4. Add the apples so that half will have the walnuts/raisins and the other half will be apples.
5. After mixed together, put in the wine or grape juice.
