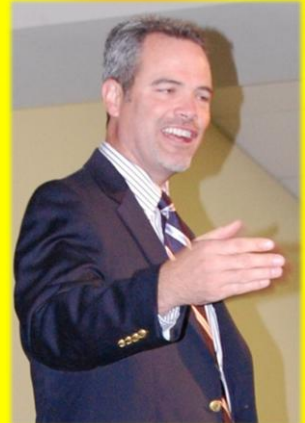

Over 250 individuals attended our Heart for Asia night in Kansas City, entitled “A Profession of Faith through Your Profession.” James Hudson Taylor IV gave an electrifying message in Mandarin with English translation. 3/4 of the audience was Chinese, and at least half of the audience stood up to commit to use their gifts for God’s glory in this generation. Pray for the many in attendance who are seeking next steps in mission. While there is a large and growing church in China, there are 400 unreached people groups in China.

Christian professionals, using their professional skills in China, are able to share their life and witness naturally among these people groups. There are incredible opportunities for people with IT, medical, teaching and business skills, as well as other skills. James Hudson Taylor IV is the great great grandson of Hudson Taylor, who started OMF International 150 years ago!

Whether it’s through action or words, encouragement or giving we are a people called to think and act with a mission. Building community and connecting with people; their hurts, their tragedies and triumphs are all apart of sharing answers, and helping dreams come true for people in serious need all around us. Because of your generosity this year we’ve been able to work in our community to see our Father’s Kingdom come here on earth. They looked confused—very confused. The receptionist at the hospital was having a hard time communicating with the young Middle Eastern couple, who obviously didn’t speak much English. As I watched the couple walk out of the building I wondered what had brought them to the hospital that day and whether they were going to get the help they needed. Not knowing the local language can be more than a frustration when it comes to urgent matters like someone’s health. So I decided to move out of my comfort zone and followed them out of the office, asking if they needed help. My one Arabic phrase got me as far as a polite greeting, but that was enough to make their eyes light up. Our brief conversation in limited English was followed by an e-mail, and then an invitation, and then a visit to their small apartment—which came with Arabic coffee and doughnuts. The couple (college students who recently arrived in the USA) asked if I might meet with them to help them learn English. Wow!—all the way from a simple “hello to a stranger” to an invitation to meet with two people who just happen to be from one of the least-evangelized nations in the world—that’s how God can work when we move outside of our comfort zone. Please pray for God to work as I (Lynda) meet with this couple each week.

We want to thank God for His great glory and to share some of the wonders with you to rejoice with us and be encouraged in faith.

In the beginning of January we started our first A and B courses. God uses this form of studying to reach local people here. We have about 15 new students in A and 11 in B course. I have a desire to teach and train new teachers and our new teachers (new believers) constantly continue to work with us. Last month we had a lot of visitors and our Guest Table Ministry worked hard. Most of our church “guests” are young people. Please pray for God’s presence to be among us when we share the Gospel as some of these young people come to argue with us. God opened doors for me to visit Afyonkarahisar City with one of our Turkish brothers. It was a great opportunity for me to share our hope with two Associate Professors at the local University. In Afyonkarahisar we started an A course with some people who are interested in our faith. We tried to meet more local people with whom our Turkish brother made connection via internet but it turned out to be a big spiritual opposition. 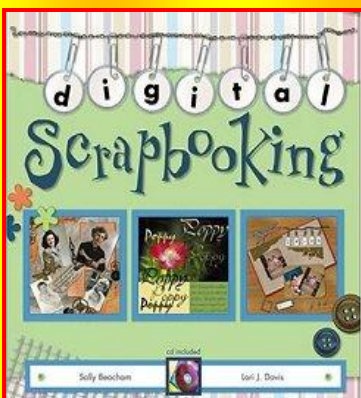
STOREHOUSE FOOD PANTRY

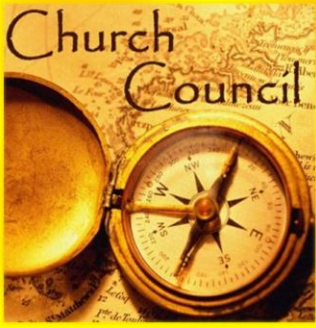
